**Ohio EPA To Accept Comments Regarding Clean Water Ltd.
(Formerly Perma-Fix of Dayton) Draft Air Permit**

Air emissions that would be allowed by a draft air permit-to-install for Clean Water Ltd. (formerly Perma-Fix of Dayton), located at 300 Cherokee Drive, Dayton, will be the focus of a public information session and hearing at 6:30 p.m. on December 4, 2008. During the meeting, representatives from Ohio EPA and the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA) will explain the air permit's purpose as well as accept public comments. The meeting will be held at Jefferson Twp. Hall, One Business Park Dr, Dayton.

The draft permit sets limits for air pollution requirements and limitations to reduce air pollution generated by the following process equipment located at Clean Water Ltd.: wastewater storage tanks, hazardous waste storage containment areas/containers, oil/water separators, organic/water separators and waste transfer systems. There are organic compounds and hazardous air pollutants emitted into the air from this process equipment.

This draft permit requires the company to reduce air emissions from the process equipment by various air pollution control methods, including installing a closed-vent system and regenerative thermal oxidizer. These will reduce air pollution generated at the facility.

Copies of the draft permit application and technical support information may be reviewed and/or copies made by first calling 937-225-4435 to make an appointment at RAPCA, 117 S. Main Street, Dayton.

Ohio EPA places a high priority on public involvement and encourages citizens to become involved in the decision-making process. During the December 4 information session, representatives from Ohio EPA will explain the proposed project and answer questions. During the hearing, which follows the information session, the public can submit comments for the record regarding the draft permit. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information that will be considered before Ohio EPA issues or proposes to deny a final permit.

In addition to presenting testimony and written documents at the hearing, Ohio EPA also will accept written comments by mail. Comments must be received by Ohio EPA by 4:30 p.m. on December 10, 2008. Comments received after this date may be considered as time allows, but will not be considered to be a part of the official record.
